## Making the seeds to grow a story

### A tool to encourage children to make the most of their vocabulary in story-writing by sparking their imaginations

#### What you'll need

- A big imagination
- A5 sheets of paper for your favourite words
- Something to write with
- Storyboard sheets copied onto A4 sheets of thin card, you can find this online: <u>http://www.bbc.co.uk/northernireland/myplacemyspace/downloads/promote</u> <u>-your-day-out/storyboard-template.pdf</u>
- Colouring pencils and pens
- Scissors
- Envelopes you could make your own envelopes too
- A lucky dip bag (optional)
- A sheet of paper, something that is different from your usual exercise books to write down the new, bigger story

#### Germinating

- 1. Write your favourite words on sheets of paper
- 2. Organise the words into piles of nouns, verbs, adjectives and other
- 3. Get into pairs
- 4. Pick two words from each pile
- 5. With your partner write a story which includes the eight words you have picked
- 6. Challenge yourself: try not to start your story with once upon a time
- 7. Don't forget, the beginning, middle and end of your story are all as important as each other

#### Storyboarding

Now use your story board sheet to draw one picture in each square to show a few of the different things that happen at the beginning, middle and end of your story.







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#### Making your 'seeds'

- 1. Cut out the six drawings from your storyboard, for example if you have drawn a tree, cut this out so we know that your story includes something about a tree
- 2. Put your six cut out drawings your 'seeds' in a seed packet shaped envelope
- 3. Write the title of your story on the envelope, be imaginative with your title, you want everyone who chooses your seed packet to get excited about your story 'seeds'
- 4. Put all your seed packets in one pile, or in a bag that would make a good lucky dip bag

#### **Growing stories**

- Pick a new seed packet from the pile or lucky dip
- Tell a story using the drawings/'seeds' in the packet, the title will give you some clues...
- Think about how to organise the drawings/'seeds' so that you have an exciting beginning, middle and end for your story
- Ask the children who made the 'seeds' you chose to tell you the original version of their story
- See if you can combine your story and theirs, and then write this new, bigger story down
