Overview 2018-19


Data shows significant growth in all moderations since April 2017, equal to 24% (April 2018 to March 2019).

The most significant growth in Discover Awards, is consistent with previous years. Bronze Arts Award moderations have also seen a significant increase.

Growth in Discover and Bronze suggests that larger scale area-based programmes delivered by Arts and Media Organisations and primary schools have increased their Arts Award delivery across both levels.




All Moderations, 2014-2019



Year on year increase / decrease of moderations from 2013-2019. Please note: Data excludes Mar-April 2019 Source: Trinity




All Moderations by Level April 18 - Mar 2019



Total Moderations by sector 2018-19

Youth projects, youth justice/Alternative Provision, and Music Hubs continue to be a priority focus, closely followed by Museums and Heritage, Libraries and secondary/SEND settings at around 5%.

Primary schools have some of the highest moderation levels. Combined with a growth in numbers of Discover moderations, suggests that more primary schools are achieving Discover than in previous years.


Many Music Hubs, Secondary Schools and Libraries moderate their Arts Awards via Arts organisations which contributes to high moderation numbers across the arts and media sector.

All moderations (pass, below pass, other) between Apr 18-Mar 19, by level Source: Trinity




Data shows that boroughs with lower moderation numbers are delivering a higher number of Bronze, Silver and Gold moderations, which take longer to achieve with a higher number of learning hours. Boroughs with high moderation levels are delivering Discover and Explore.

This suggests that boroughs are choosing to deliver large groups of lower qualifications, in a shorter time-span, or more sustained programmes at a higher level with smaller groups.


Moderations and Award Levels across the 6 boroughs with lowest moderation rates

Numbers show despite a significant increase across London in the past year, boroughs that were achieving lower levels of moderations in previous years are achieving less than they previously.

Boroughs that were achieving high levels of moderations in previous years have seen a general upswing in numbers and are achieving more than previously.
