

I Am Festival 2022

Brief for organisations with venues

Budget: up to £3,000 including VAT

Time commitment: 6 days

Timescale: February – June 2022. I Am Festival will take place from 20–24 June 2022

This year A New Direction will be delivering the sixth annual I Am Festival in June 2022. The I Am Festival is a yearly celebration empowering D/deaf, disabled, and neurodivergent young people to explore their creativity. Over the past five years, the festival has provided a platform for hundreds of young people to showcase their talents, leadership, ideas, and opinions.

Last year we worked with schools in our SEND Network to deliver creative in-person sessions in the lead up to the festival. Outcomes of these creative sessions were then showcased via our bespoke digital platform. We also partnered with a number of fantastic disabled-led arts organisations to deliver workshops remotely.

This blended delivery model allowed us to engage many young people who may not have otherwise been able to take part in an in-person festival. This is something we are excited about developing further for this year's festival, as we aim to deliver a hybrid of activity in schools, cultural venues, and online.

The theme this year is **Unity**.

To curate the I Am Festival 2022, we will be working with our SEND Network and a team of Cultural Ambassadors.

About the SEND Network

A New Direction's SEND Network is a free professional development programme for educators working with D/deaf, disabled and neurodivergent children and young people in London's schools and specialist settings. The Network meets twice a term over the academic year, working together to improve creative and cultural opportunities for children and young people who are D/deaf, disabled and neurodivergent.

SEND Network members are able to share good practice with other teachers working across a huge range of SEND settings in London. The network also provides an

opportunity to meet and share strategies and ideas for bringing the curriculum to life in ways that meet students' needs.

About the Cultural Ambassadors

This year will be our third year collaborating with charity my AFK to provide a work experience programme for disabled young adults. This iteration of the programme will involve 10 young people working collaboratively with A New Direction, the SEND Network, and artists and arts organisations for 16 weeks. They will co-design workshops for schools, consult with organisations about their accessibility for disabled young people, lead a festival project, and support the delivery of events throughout the festival week.

Overview

A New Direction are looking for proposals from London-based creative organisations with venues to collaborate, develop, and deliver workshops with our SEND Network and Cultural Ambassadors. We are particularly interested in hearing from disabled-led arts organisations.

Workshops will be developed with teachers and Cultural Ambassadors and delivered to students in SEND settings. The outcomes of the workshops will be showcased at our hybrid I Am Festival in June 2022.

We are looking for proposals for workshops in any artform that will explore the theme of **Unity**, and for organisations who can support elements of the work experience programme.

Details

- We are looking for **two** London-based arts and cultural organisations with accessible venues
- Each organisation will commit to working in collaboration with our Cultural Ambassadors, allowing them to:
 - o Discuss the accessibility of their spaces and programmes
 - o Tour venue spaces and speak with members of staff (once the individual interests of the Cultural Ambassadors are identified, it is hoped that relevant members of staff in organisations will be able to be interviewed and/or shadowed)

- Experience a performance, screening, exhibition etc., dependent on the organisation's artform
- Plan creative workshops to be delivered in schools
- Organisations will deliver creative workshops in schools exploring the theme of Unity. Depending on the students, this could be one longer workshop or broken down into a series of shorter workshops
- Organisations will also provide space for one day during the I Am Festival for the outcome of the workshops to be publicly shared, and welcome students from SEND schools to the space.
 - Organisations should consider how the outcome of the workshops could be engaged with during the festival, either in person or digitally. For example, could a piece of artwork be added to by members of the public?
 - Organisations are also encouraged to consider how students who are not involved in the workshops can also benefit
- Organisations will meet with A New Direction's evaluator to support the overall evaluation of the programme
