Go & See

The Primary Arts Go & See programme will offer a range of opportunities for pupils and their teachers to experience film and the performing arts in London.

This programme will give pupils and staff the opportunity to experience the arts within venues rather than at school. It also aims to support teachers to connect these experiences to classroom learning, through light-touch CPD sessions.

Go & See Theatre is delivered in partnership with Polka Theatre. Go & See Film is delivered in partnership with Into Film. Go & See Art is delivered in partnership with Frameless and the Royal Academy of Arts.

Schools will:

- Receive tickets for a group cinema screening, theatre performance, or gallery visit in London.
- The cinema and theatre performances are suitable for Key Stage 2 pupils. The Frameless visits are suitable for KS2 pupils and the Royal Academy of Arts visits are suitable for KS1 and KS2.
- Be supported to connect these experiences to classroom learning and the National Curriculum through tailored CPD Masterclasses and resources.
- Be supported with risk assessments and travel plans.

Access & Inclusion

An access budget will be available to support participant engagement in this programme, for example for transport, BSL interpretation or other costs.

Eligibility

The Primary Arts Go & See strand is aimed at state primary mainstream and special schools in London. The programme will be designed to support your pupils' personal enjoyment, wellbeing and enrichment through the arts, as well as supporting their learning through CPD for teachers.

Your school must be in a **London borough** to be eligible for the programme.

If your school or a member of your school staff is participating in another area of the Primary Arts programme, **you are still eligible** to take part in this strand of the programme.

How to Make a Booking Request

Please note that it is unlikely you will be allocated tickets for both the theatre and cinema options.

Please read carefully the offer descriptions on the pages that follow, consider your school's needs and areas of interest, and identify your first and second choice of offer. Each description includes year group suitability – please ensure the offer you are interested in is available for the year group you would like to participate.

When you are ready to make a booking request, please complete the booking request form. The form asks for practical information as well as date availability and will take around 10 minutes to complete. Once you have submitted the booking request form, we will contact you within 10 days.

Please note that while the Go & See programme is free of charge to schools, we may charge a fee of up to £500 for cancellations with less than 48 hours' notice. Delivered in partnership with Into Film, this programme will offer screenings in five cinemas (regionally N/E/S/W and central London), as well as offering a choice of two 90-minute mini-masterclasses online for teachers supporting the visits, plus resources to support planning before the cinema trip, and classroom activity after it.

About the film

Fantastic Mr Fox (2009) is suitable for children aged 7 and over and is 1 hour 30 minutes in length. It is a stop-motion animation version of Roald Dahl's woodland tale that combines a beautiful old-fashioned aesthetic with Wes Anderson's trademark dialogue.

Relevant for exploring topics including English, Art & Design and PSHE Education in addition to highlighting themes surrounding Roald Dahl, family, animals, and rural life.

A New Direction have partnered with five cinemas, so you can choose which cinema and date is most convenient for your school and your pupils. Doors will open half an hour before each time slot. There will be no adverts or trailers and the film start time is prompt.

Delivered in partnership with the Royal Academy of Arts, your class will be able to visit the [Young Artists' Summer Show \(YASS\)](#), an exciting opportunity for young people aged 4–19 to exhibit their artwork online and at the RA. You should allow for around 30 minutes in the gallery.

Now in its sixth year, the Young Artists' Summer Show is a free, open submission exhibition for young people aged 4–19 studying in the UK. Artworks are judged by a panel of artists and arts professionals, with selected artworks displayed online and on-site at the Royal Academy of Arts. Teachers may also like to extend their visit to the [free Collections Gallery](#) which is just upstairs from Young Artists' Summer Show.
