Welcome to Brixton House!

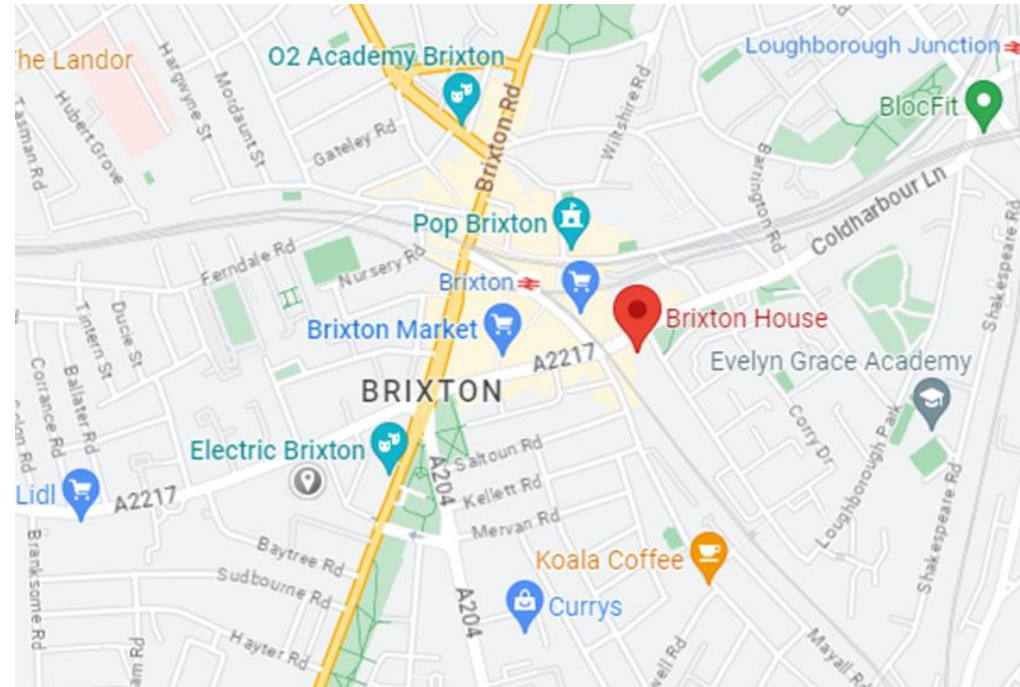
Whether you are coming to see a show or take part in a tour or a workshop, we hope this visual guide helps to make your trip to Brixton House as straightforward and comfortable as possible.

Where is Brixton House?

Brixton House is located on 385 Coldharbour Lane, Brixton, London, SW9 8GL



We're located on the corner of Coldharbour Lane and Somerleyton Road. It is approximately 10 minutes' walk from the centre of Brixton.



Access

Your Arrival

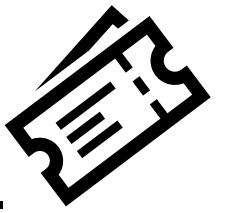
When you enter Brixton House, you will use the front entrance which are automatic doors. You will see a big open space with lots of chairs and seats, this is called the foyer.

The foyer area looks like this:





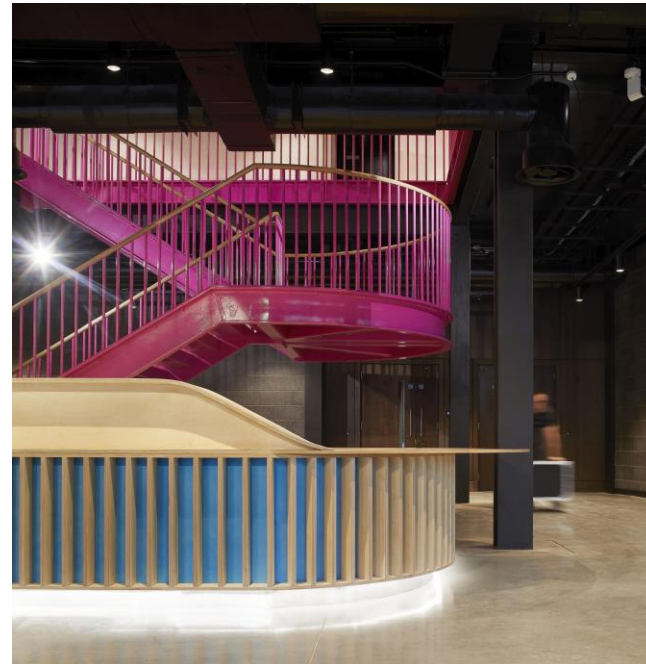
Box Office



Our Box Office is located near the entrance in the Foyer.

Tickets are paperless and will have been emailed to you if you have booked on the phone or online. When you arrive, present your QR code on your phone (or print it out at home) to one of our ushers for scanning. Our Ushers will be by the theatre door, wearing a black Brixton House t-shirt.

You can also buy your ticket at our Box Office. Our Box office looks like this:





Café Bar



You can buy snacks or drinks at our café bar. Our opening hours are:

Mon-Sun 9am-6pm

Sometimes the café/bar can be busy before a show. Many customers use the café bar during the day to socialise or work.

Our Theatre Spaces



There are two different theatre spaces in Brixton House
The main theatre, **Theatre one** seats up to 200 people
and the smaller space, **Theatre two** up to 120 people.

this:



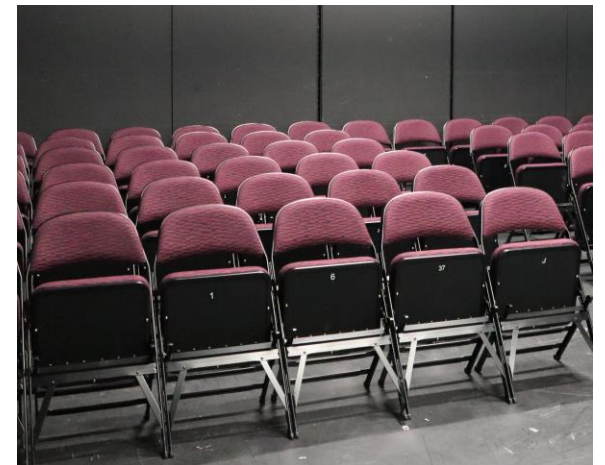
Finding your seat in Theatre two

When the actors are ready to begin the performance the doors will be opened and an usher will help you find your seat. In Theatre two the seats are unreserved which means you can sit anywhere you like. The seats in Theatre two look like this:





Theatre one

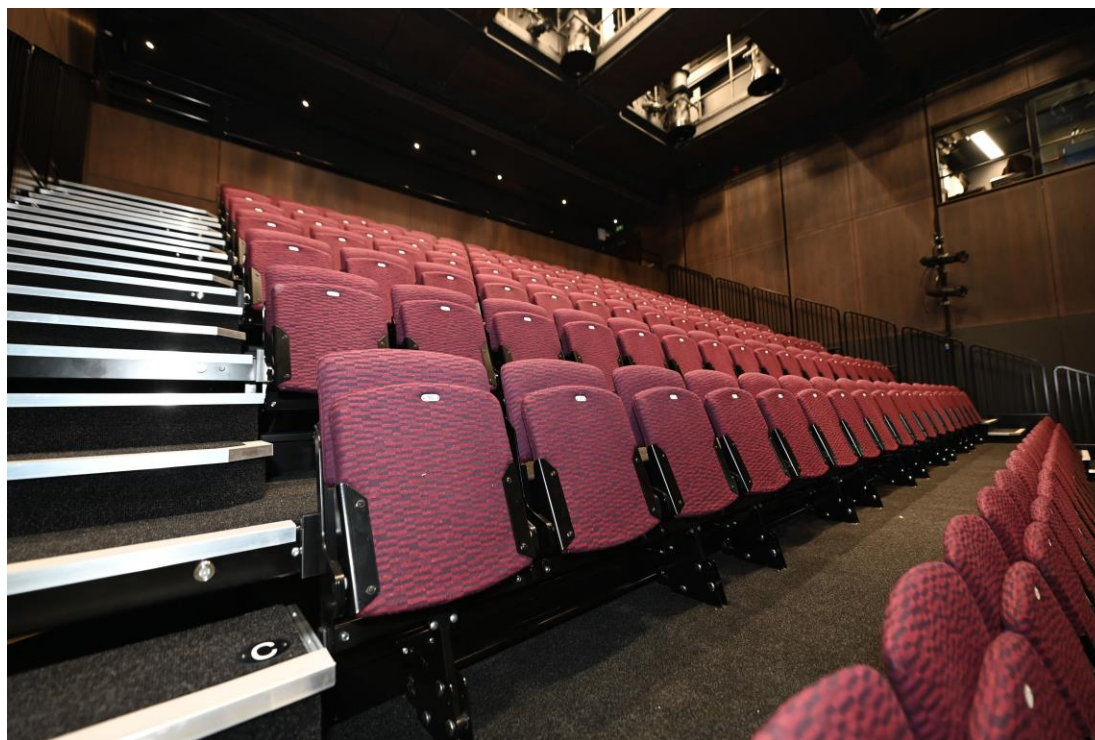
Our larger theatre space is called **Theatre one** and looks like this:





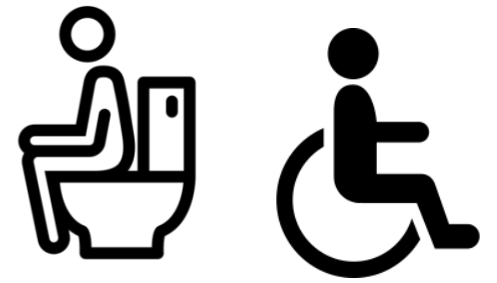
Finding your seat in Theatre one

The row letter is at the end of the aisle and the seat will have a number on it and it matches the number on the ticket. Seat rows and numbers look like this:

The entrance to the toilets looks like this:

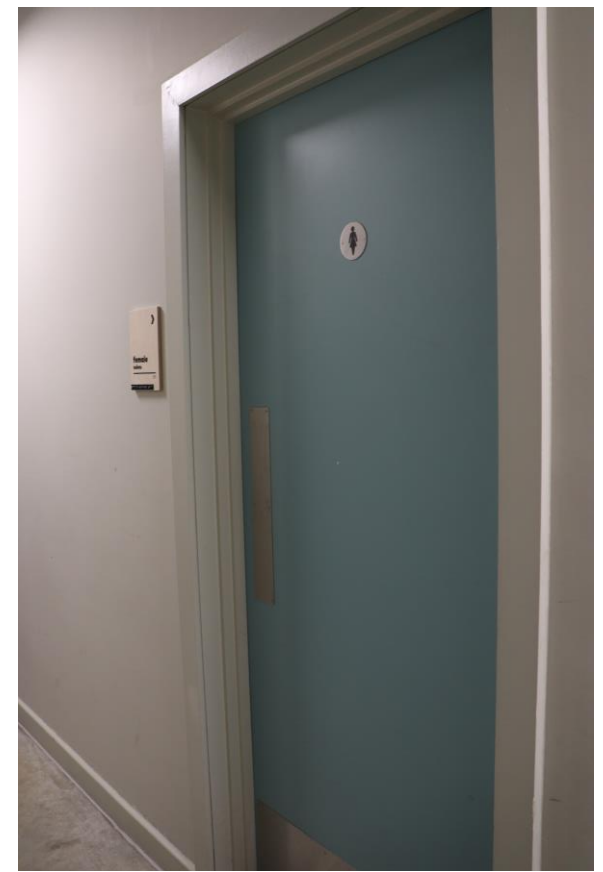
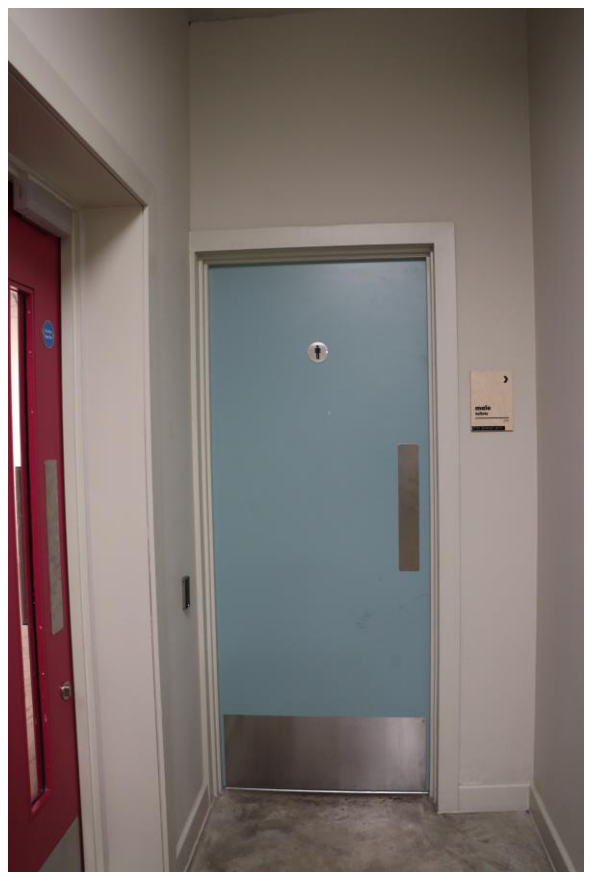




Toilets

Restrictions



BAGS



We do not have room to store large bags or suitcases whilst you watch the show. There is only space for a handbag or a medium sized rucksack.

Please bring the essentials with you.



MOBILE DEVICES

Please make sure all mobile phones or tablets are switched off during the performance

PHOTOS



You are able to take photos in the café/bar area or in the front area of the building. Once you are inside the performance space, please do not take any photos of the actors or set.



What happens inside a show?



START: The start time for the play will be written on your ticket. We will make an announcement to let you know that the theatre is open and the show is about to begin.

Please aim to be in your seat about 5 minutes before the performance is about to start.



MIDDLE: In the middle of the play there is sometimes an interval to allow the actors and the audience to rest.

The interval will last for about 20 minutes. The lights will get brighter and you can leave the theatre space to buy something at the café bar or go to the toilet.



END: You will know when it is the end of the play because the actors will take a bow and the audience will clap.

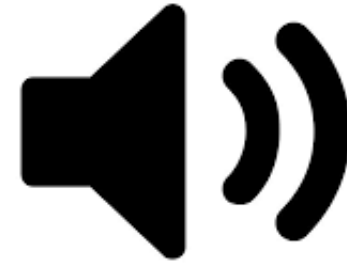
There will be lots of people leaving the show so it may be busy in the café bar.



Sights and sounds during a show



LIGHTS: When the play is on there might be some bright lights.



SOUNDS: There might also be some sound effects or music coming from the speakers.



CLAPPING: Mainly at the end of the play or in the interval there maybe some clapping and cheering to show they are enjoying the show, you can clap and cheer too if you want to.



LAUGHING: During the play the actors may make jokes and some of the audience may laugh. You can laugh as well if you want to.
